About the Training

The Nurses Respond Now Priority Training was developed to ensure that the current nursing workforce is better prepared to meet the health equity needs of vulnerable populations during public health emergencies.

This 6 hour faculty guided online learning option is designed to be completed independently within 30 days following the course sequencing, study guide and faculty prompts embedded in the recorded lectures. With this option, nurses register for the course, receive email confirmation, log in and begin.
